Whereas H. E. Carter, Curator of the Estate of Walter Keys deceased of said County, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, August H. Fuechsel a Justice of the said County, that A. H. Keys on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1877 in said County, feloniously did steal take and carry away, One Bay Horse, One White and Red Spotted Horned Cow, and other personal property, belong giving to the Estate of the said Walter Keys deceased.

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said A. H. Keys to answer the said complains and to be farther dealt with, according to law.

Prince William County to Wit:

Be it remembered, that on this 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1877 John Carter and Walter H. Abel of said County, personally came before me August H. Fuechsel a Justice of the said County, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the manner and form following, that is to say: The said John Carter in the sum of Fifty Dollars, and the said W. H. Abel in the sum of Fifty Dollars, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia, of the said A. H. Keys shall make default in the performance of the underwritten condition.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that if the above bound A. H. Keys do and shall personally appear on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1877 before the County Court of said County, at the Courthouse thereof, and then and there answer a bill of indictment to be preferred to the grand jury in and for the said county, against him, the said A. H. Keys for a felony by him committed, for unlawfully steal and take away a Bay Horse and a White & Red spotted Cow, so hereof the said A. H. Keys stands charged, and shall not depart without the leave of the said court, then the above recognizance shall be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
