Jan 15th – My dear father left for the south, going to W. City to start. I miss him dreadfully now – got coal oil – he gave me \$6.00 – got butter 36 & ____ .25 from Jimmy Baker – paid for them.

Jan 19th – Thursday, George had Bessie & Mollie shod at a cost of \$1.11 – Frank got his supper things.

Jan 20th – Friday, George got \$1.50 wanted it to go on last year's. I got piece of beef from Rose paid .75 & owe a little balance. Peter came up – I lent him my buggy but it not go down – sent Mrs. Keyser .25 for N. C's present – paid sister .50 I borrowed – Kate sent home from school.

Jan 21st – Saturday, Clarence Ennis cut wood all day for Gray & did very well. Got a telegram from Mr. Bell ____ of my dear fathers safe arrival & feel very thankful.

Jan 22nd – Sunday, Passed every gently ____ great deal & my eyes hurt so I had to stay. Kate came very late.

Jan 23rd – Monday, Sent Geo. & Albert to keep Mr. G. with telephone

Jan 24th – Tuesday, Sent again & Mr. G. came to put it in. He got here about dark. Got my dear father's letter

Jan 25th – Wednesday, One of the very worst days I ever saw since the Blizzard. Geo. came & has done so well. He could not think if getting the mail. I write to Willie & L. L.

Jan 26th – Thursday, Last night was the coldest we have had but we were comfortable. Geo. came this morning always a relief. Nice letter from Mr. Beale about Pa.

Jan 27th – Friday, Warmer, but cloudy, am so afraid it will snow before we get ice.

Jan 28th – Saturday, Filled ice house with fine ice. Kate went home. Man did not come for cattle. Talked to Mr. Moore then to L----.

Jan 29th – Sunday, A very gentle day – Wrote to Pa & all the Berkeley men – Kate came in Eve.

Jan 30th – Monday, Snowing but has cleared off. Kate did not go to school. Heard from cousin Mary about Pa

Jan 31st – Tuesday, The man came to say the cattle are to stay longer so I suppose I'll have to _____. Frank went to haul wood for himself.

Feb. 1st – Wednesday, Frank left without a word. I hired Clarence by the month til Pa comes – Killed the firm little hog R. helped. Kate came from school having spent the night at Mill Park. Got 5 gals. Oil from Mr. Gossom.

Feb. 2nd – Thursday, Peter walked up to tell us about Jenel being sick & we were very much distressed that night. Mrs. Rust telephoned me she was dead & I could not tell Kate & Peter later got Miss Macy to tell her. We both wept ourselves nearly to death. It was Peters birth day & if him even remembers

Feb 3rd – Friday, Kate went to school & got me to phone Mr. Rob about Jenel & to say she ----

Feb 5th – Sunday, She & myself went to Church & came right back after a shower in a thn. Storm.

Feb 6th – Monday, N. Walker up – I paid Thompson 60 cents for getting ice – Man came to see about cattle & said he could not take them earlier. Man came for cattle Feb. 10th - I loaned a dollar for Jinny from Uncle & \$3 to send to the mill & \$1 for Clarence.

Feb. 14th – I borrowed from Mr. Smith \$17, paid \$5 to Mr. Ran smith for fodder – paid \$1.25 for groceries. Jinny .25 & .50 to Willis Foley for two shocks of fodder.

 Paid Mr. Mountjoy on 18th \$10.00 - Paid Alice same day \$2.00. Got check from Pa for thirty dollars. Paid Mr. Smith back in full of \$17 I borrowed.
