

Clerk's Loose Papers

Prince William County to Wit:

Be it remembered that on this the 21st day of December 1897 John W. Fair and George S. Cornwell of the said county personally came before me Edgar M. Cornwell, Justice of the said county and severally acknowledged themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia John W. Fair the sum of \$100 one hundred dollars and the said George S. Cornwell, one hundred dollars to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels lands and tenements if he the said John W. Fair shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten, the condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound John W. Fair shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of the Commonwealth and especially towards Willis A. Beavers for and during the term of one year from the 21st day of December 1897 then this recognizance shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. Taken and acknowledged before me in the said county this the 21st day of December 1897.
